7th & 8th December 2024 LITURGY OF THE WORD

Entrance Antiphon

O people of Sion, behold, the Lord will come to save the nations, and the Lord will make the glory of his voice heard in the joy of your heart.

FIRST READING

A reading from the prophet Baruch (5:1-9) (Jerusalem - God will show your splendour).

Jerusalem, take off your dress of sorrow and distress, put on the beauty of the glory of God for ever, wrap the cloak of the integrity of God around you, put the diadem of the glory of the Eternal on your head: since God means to show your splendour to every nation under heaven, since the name God gives you for ever will be, 'Peace integrity, and honour through through devotedness'. Arise, Jerusalem, stand on the heights and turn your eyes to the east: see your sons reassembled from west and east at the command of the Holy One, jubilant that God has remembered them. Though they left you on foot, with enemies for an escort, now God brings them back to you like royal princes carried back in glory. For God has decreed the flattening of each high mountain, of the everlasting hills, the filling of the valleys to make the ground level so that Israel can walk in safety under the glory of God. And the forests and every fragrant tree will provide shade for Israel at the command of God; for God will guide Israel in joy by the light of his glory with his mercy and integrity for escort.

Resumption of Communion from the Chalice in the Diocese of Wollongong

Bishop Brian has announced the lifting of the restriction on Communion from the chalice in the Diocese of Wollongong that was put in place during the Covid pandemic. This will take effect from the beginning of the upcoming Liturgical Year on Sunday 1 December 2024, the First Sunday of Advent.

However, In our parish, Communion from the Chalice will resume starting January 2025 but no one will be forced to receive from the Chalice.

REFLECTION: Prepare a way for the Lord

There was a famous preacher who Sunday after Sunday faced a large, attentive congregation. One Sunday as he approached the pulpit the words of the Gospel were ringing in his ears: 'Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight.' A thought suddenly struck him: It's not the Lord's paths that need to be straightened out but ours.

From the Pulpit he looked into the expectant faces of the men and women before him, and wondered what these words might mean for them. What were the things that needed to be straightened out in their lives? He realised that only they could answer that. Nevertheless, there was one area he felt qualified to speak about - their often twisted and tangled relationships.

He had know these people for a long time. They had come to him for help and guidance with their problems. He knew the petty spites that embittered their hearts, the animosities that set neighbour against neighbour, the silly quarrels that were kept alive, the jealousies and misunderstandings, the stubborn pride.

He decided to address a message to those bitter, unbending ones who refused to forgive and forget. He would impress on them that life was too short to harbour grudges and resentments. He would plead with them for mutual tolerance and understanding. He would speak to them from the heart as though he was speaking to each separately. So, he began: 'My dear brothers and sisters, let me repeat to you the words of the Gospel: "Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight." It's not the Lord's paths that need to be straightened but ours.

"We let misunderstandings run on from year to year, meaning to clear them up some day. We keep quarrels alive because we cannot quite make up our minds to sacrifice our pride and end them.'We pass people sullenly, not speaking to them out of some silly spite, and yet knowing that it would fill us with shame and remorse if we heard that one of them were dead tomorrow.

We let our neighbour starve, till we hear that he is dying of starvation; or our friend's heart ache for a word of appreciation, which we mean to give him some day. 'If only we could realise that "the him some day. 'If only we could realise that "the time is short", how it would break the spell. How we would go instantly and do the thing which we might never have another chance to do. 'I repeat: It's not Lord's paths that need to be straightened out but ours. So, if there is some crooked attitude, or some crooked way of behaving, or some crooked relation-ship that needs to be straighten out, let us straighten ship that needs to be straighten out, let us straighten it out. Then we will truly be preparing a way for the Lord to come to us.'

He ended his sermon there. His words area worth pondering on. How difficult things are for the one who walks a crooked path. But how easy things are for the one who walks the straight path-the path of truth, honesty and goodness. But to walk a straight path one needs strength, wisdom, and single -mindedness.
